

Understanding School Parking

Abiding by parking restrictions around schools creates a safer environment for students and parents. It also assists traffic flow and reduces the angst parents may feel when trying to do the right thing.



What can parents do?

- Walk or cycle to school instead of driving.
- Park nearby and walk to the school or if your child is old enough get them to walk to you.
- Children love independence and learning, so encourage your child to walk to your vehicle and ask questions about what they learnt along the way.
- Car pool your children and your friend's children.
- Check the signage and be aware of parking restrictions.

Set Down and Pick Up Zones (Kiss and Drive)

Set down and pick up zones are for parents to briefly pick up or drop off their children. The objective is for traffic to flow, moving forward when space is available. Cars are not to be parked or left unattended as it disrupts the flow of traffic.

Parking Restrictions

Listed below are some signs you are likely to see around your school. There are also restrictions that are not sign-posted. Not abiding by these restrictions can result in infringements being issued. Penalties for these infringements range from \$60 to \$120, depending on the offence.

Without Signs

Verge Parking – You need permission from the resident to park on their verge.

Driveways – No part of your vehicle can overhang and/or block a driveway.

Footpaths – No parking on footpaths or pedestrian crossings. This includes all paved areas.

Double Parking – Do not park on the road alongside a car that is already parked. (It interferes with traffic flow and can cause accidents).

Parking against the flow of traffic – Always remember to park in the direction of travel and not against it, with the passenger door being on the kerb side of the road. Exercise caution and look for cyclists and other footpath users.

With Signs



Bus Zone – This sign and its arrows indicate areas reserved for buses only. It may also state certain times. Outside of these times vehicles can park in this area.



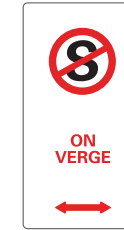
Parking – If you see a green 'P' the number before it represents how many hours you can leave your vehicle parked on the road in this area. It may also have the days/times this time restriction applies.



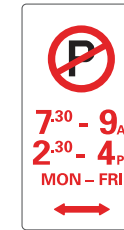
No Stopping – Your vehicle cannot be stopped or parked at any time on the road. This includes stopping your vehicle to drop-off or pick-up a passenger.



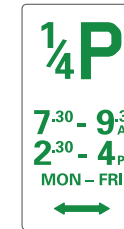
No Parking – This symbol means no parking or leaving your vehicle unattended at any time.



No Parking and No Stopping on Verge – These signs mean vehicles can not park on this verge at any time.



No Parking Between – This sign means no parking during the times specified, however parking is allowed outside of these times.



15 Minute Parking – This sign means that a vehicle can only be parked for 15 minutes during the times and days specified. Outside of these times parking is unrestricted (unless signed).



Set Down and Pick Up sign – This is an area to drop off and pick up your children. No parking or leaving your vehicle unattended allowed. All Kiss and Drive signs will be changed to Set Down and Pick Up signs.



Your child's safety comes first, which is why parking restrictions are in place.
